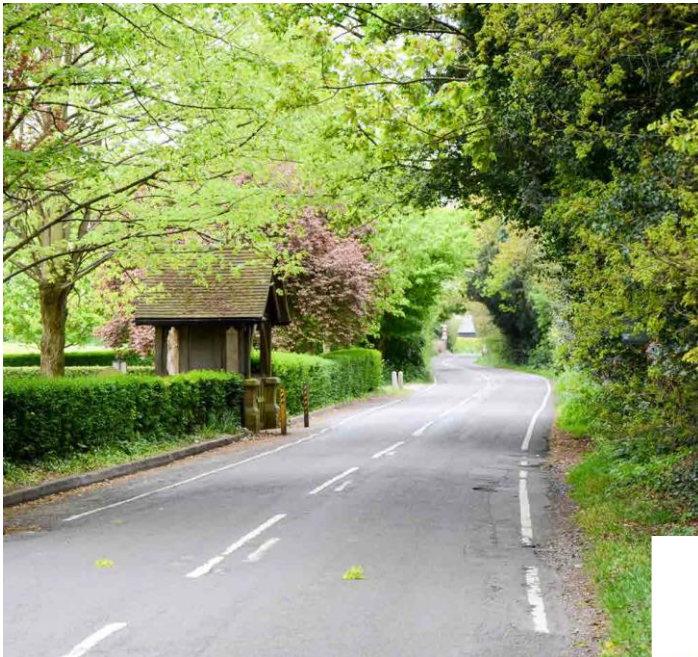


Thorpe Neighbourhood Plan

Areas of focus

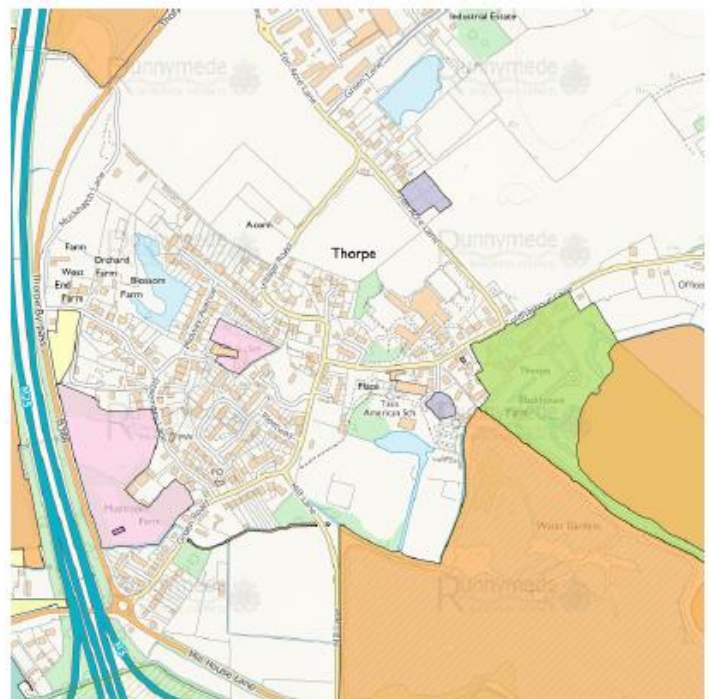
Key aspects that the plan would include are:
